About Minara Resources

Minara Resources (Minara) is one of Australia's largest nickel producers, and one of the top ten in the world, with headquarters in Perth, Western Australia.

Minara owns and operates the Murrin Murrin nickel-cobalt joint venture project (with Glencore International AG) in Western Australia's historic northern goldfields region. Murrin Murrin is a world-class hydrometallurgical project, utilising high-pressure acid leach technology to recover nickel and cobalt from laterite ores.

Minara's vision is to deliver high-quality products within budget and with the highest regard for its people, their safety and the environment.

Working with communities

Minara's operations impact on a range of communities, both in the regions where its operations are located, and in the areas within which their employees live.

Consultation with stakeholders, including local community groups and government authorities, is an integral part of the way in which the company does business. Minara aims to ensure that communities are engaged and informed, particularly during the planning and development phases at its Murrin Murrin operations.

Minara's commitment to local communities encompasses sourcing local employees, services and suppliers. Minara provides training opportunities for current and new employees to attract and retain the highest quality workforce.

Minara also provides in-kind and financial support for a range of community initiatives.

What is the Minara Community Foundation?

In an effort to enhance its community support, Minara operates the Minara Community Foundation, for the long-term benefit of people in the northern goldfields. The foundation is assisted by ANZ Trustees, providing specialist trusteeship and administration services. The foundation exists in perpetuity so that local communities and future generations will benefit beyond the life of the mine.

The foundation supports projects that provide:

- educational benefits;
- economic, social, cultural and heritage benefits;
- economic development, training and education opportunities;
- transport and communication services;
- programs and initiatives for future generations; and
- protection for Indigenous culture.

How will grants be made?

Minara established the foundation in 2007 with an initial contribution of \$1 million and an annual contribution of \$250,000 per financial year for five years.

The initial contribution to the foundation has been invested with ANZ Trustees. The annual contribution plus a portion of the return on investment is made available as grants to the community.

How is the foundation managed?

The Minara Community Foundation and ANZ Trustees work together for the benefit of the local community to oversee the governance and administration of the trust and its grant programs.
